"All these people are here because they want to help raise awareness for disabilities," Kevin said.

"Last year it rained really hard, and we had 100 people. This year, it's cold and snowy. It really doesn't matter to this group. They just want to get out and support any kind of inclusive effort that they can. We're just very proud to be here."

"This is a proud moment for Athens, too" Kevin continued. "Athens is a great city, very inclusive, very innovative. Events like this just help further the cause."

Members of the various groups marched from Ohio University's Baker Center to the Athens County Courthouse. Once there, marchers gathered to hear words from Autumn Brown, the ACBDD's director of Integrate Athens; Athens Mayor Steve Patterson; State Rep. Jay Edwards (R-Nelsonville); and William Peacock, chairman of Athens County People First.
