About us



Early Intervention:

Early Intervention serves children from birth through age 2. We provide services mostly in the home to help children reach developmental milestones, improve outcomes, and empower families. In 2018, this program served 61 children.

Transportation:

Our transportation department offers a vital resource by increasing individuals' access to educational services, employment, and opportunities for community inclusion. Our fleet traveled a total of 189,489 miles in 2018.

Employment Options:

Employment Options & Personnel Plus assist individuals with establishing career goals, and securing and maintaining employment. In 2018, this division assisted 153 people.

Beacon School:

Beacon School & Preschool serves children from 3 through 22. Students receive educational and specialized services to reach their individual goals. In 2018, these programs served 61 students.











F.A.N.s Program:

The Friends Allies and Neighbors program brings together individuals with and without disabilities based on shared interests. In 2018, the program served 70 individuals.



Service & Support:

Our Service & Support Administration division provides case management to help individuals connect to the community – through school, employment, housing, recreation and other ways that are meaningful to the individual. In 2018, the division supported 387 individuals.

UI/MUI:

Our Unusual Incident / Major Unusual Incident department helps individuals who have been involved with situations that adversely affect health and welfare. In 2018, this department assisted 111 individuals with MUIs.



The ACBDD oversees a variety of programs and services that cover the entire lifespan. From birth through the end of life, the ACBDD is there to assist Athens County residents with developmental disabilities.











Highlights from 2018



First march for disability awareness:

We hosted the region's and state's firstever march for disability awareness. A bit of rain did not prevent nearly 100 people from participating. It was the perfect way to kick off March as Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.

SSA office moves to The Plains:

Thanks to the hard work of our Facilities crew, the SSA department was relocated to a newly renovated office in The Plains. This has allowed everyone in the department to work in the same building. We look forward to being good neighbors in The Plains for many years to come.

As part of a statewide effort, we joined in full force to fix the waiting list for Home and Community-Based Services. What was overly complex and a poor representation of true need is now simpler, more accurate, and designed to get individuals services when they need them.

In celebration of its 35th year in operation, Personnel Plus hosted its biggest Employee/Employer Gala yet. Nearly 350 people attended. The gala celebrated workers of diverse abilities and recognizing the value they bring to their communities.

A tribute to ATCO

ATCO, the agency's beloved adult program of nearly 50 years and birthplace of both Personnel *Plus* and Passion Works, officially closed its doors in December 2018 after completing its three-year transition. The ACBDD, along with DD boards across the state, was ordered by the federal government to divest itself of programs like ATCO. Staff agency-wide worked diligently to make sure individuals served by the program would continue to have access to the services they received at ATCO. They successfully completed this task, and we are proud of their work.



Total: \$10,725,409



In 2018, the ACBDD increased the number of individuals served by 10% over the previous year. The success of our Employment Options division, Personnel Plus, and the expansion of our waiver services accounted for the growth in participation. Calendar year 2018 ended with expenditures exceeding revenues by \$48,056 (.45%). In order to provide adequate working space for the SSA Division, capital funds were used to repurpose the building previously occupied by Personnel Plus, saving the agency thousands when compared to alternative options.
